

## National Application Form – to conduct research in schools in more than one state or territory in Australia

Schooling systems across Australia welcome research in schools that is of high quality, is consistent with the provisions of the *National Statement on Ethical Conduct in Human Research* and which meets additional guidelines for research conducted in or through schools or other educational sites.

**Researchers wishing to undertake research in more than one State or Territory complete a single national application form and apply separately to each jurisdiction.**

Each jurisdiction in Australia then assesses applications to conduct research in its schools/sites according to their own research approval guidelines, although they apply broadly similar criteria.

When assessing research applications, all jurisdictions give consideration to:

- **benefit** – the potential benefit of the research – especially educational benefit
- **feasibility** – the likelihood that these benefits will be realised
- **impact** – on time and effort required by staff and students as participants and co-investigators and in particular, on the learning programs of students
- **ethical** requirements – whether the participants (including staff, students and the parents/carers of students) are accorded the respect and protection that is due to them. Please note that active informed consent is the preference of all jurisdictions, with applications for other forms of consent considered on a case-by-case basis
- **legislative** and **policy** requirements – for example legislation regarding privacy and confidentiality, the risk of participants legally incriminating themselves or others and the high levels of duty of care expected of all educational jurisdictions for the students in their care
- **sensitivities** – the appropriateness of conducting the proposed research activities in a school setting, in particular, the appropriateness of the recruitment and consent processes, the data to be collected; and the method of data collection.

Likely benefits and feasibility are considered in relation to likely impacts as well as ethical, legislative or policy requirements and sensitivities of conducting the research in a school setting. The impact of the research on children and the extent of disruptions or interruptions to their normal learning programs will be a major consideration.

Please note research projects with the following characteristics are more likely to be rejected or modified:

- have the potential for a high level of personal intrusion on participants emotionally, psychologically and/or physically
- involve the administration of medications and/or drugs
- potentially lead participants to unreasonably incriminate themselves, such as in illicit drug taking, stealing or carrying weapons
- focus disproportionately or sensationally on negative behaviour
- have the potential to stimulate stress or risk taking behaviour
- have the potential to adversely affect the school education setting
- have the potential to adversely affect educational progress or development of children
- use passive rather than active consent
- have the possibility to identify individual participants, classes, schools, early childhood settings, sectors or states in the report or
- undertaken for commercial, marketing or journalistic purposes.

For research involving face-to-face interaction with children (or in the case of some jurisdictions, as a condition of entry into a school) researchers are required to obtain a **Working With Children Check**. Some jurisdictions do not recognise Working With Children Checks issued by other States and Territories; in these jurisdictions researchers would be required to make a separate application for a Working With Children Check.

The arrangements for each jurisdiction regarding Working With Children Checks are outlined below.
